To all parents please be advised for those student receiving medication;

Ct. State Law requires a practitioner's written order and parent/guardian authorization for a nurse to administer medication.

Prescriptive medication must be in pharmacy- prepared containers and labeled with name of child, name of drug, strength, dosage, frequency, practitioner's name and date of original prescription

Medication will destroyed if it is not picked up within one week following termination of the order or one week beyond the close of school.

For safety reason it is required that medication be hand delivered to the nurse or school principal by parent/guardian or an adult.

Student Illness or Injury

Although we stress the importance of good attendance, a student who appears ill should remain at home. Please do not send sick students to school to be examined by the school nurse. This may expose many others to unnecessary illness.

Children with a fever of 100.5 °F will be sent home from school after contacting parents. Before students are excused from school for illness or injury, parents/guardians are notified.

Therefore it is most important that current home and work telephone numbers be available at school for parents/guardians and a friend or relative who may be contacted to authorize release from school, and can come to pick up the student.

Your cooperation with timely notification to the school of any changes in phone numbers is vital. Accidental injuries at school will be given first aid by the school nurse, or in nurse's absence, by a trained staff member.

In a major, life-threatening emergency, the paramedics will be called. In emergencies or in serious accidental injury the parents/guardians will be notified and advised if further medical care is needed.
