Video Communications

Intro to video and photo (5) – Practicing basic skills for photography and video production.
Video Production I, II* & III* (10) – Full year courses in video production.



Business

Introduction to Computers (5) – Introduction to computer programming, coding, and databases.
Computer Applications (10) – Business class on Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, Excel, and Publisher.
Marketing (10) – Business class focused on sales and communicating with customers. Students operate the school store.
Entrepreneurship (10) – Business class focused on creating and running one's own business.
Personal Finance (10) – Money management and investments.

Introduction to Studio Arts (5), Studio Arts I, Studio Arts II* - Foundation skills of painting, drawing, and mixed media.
